Following my letter dated 1 April by which you were invited to review the Environmental Impact Statement for the Port of Gaza which was prepared by Witteveen & Bos, additional material was sent to you as your review advice on the EIS was to study some aspects in more detail.

With reference to the EIA agreement between DGIS and the Commission, I would appreciate if your review approach in the changing circumstances could be one of 'planning through an incremental environmental evaluation'.

Advisory reports can be produced at specific points in time, after consultation between the Commission, DEW/BL (Rutgers) and DML/MI (Wevers), as it cannot be foreseen at this point in time when documents will become available.

APPENDIX 2

Project information

Proposed activity: The Palestinian Authority (PA) proposes to build a port to support the economic development of the Gaza Strip and the West Bank and reduce dependence upon other transportation routes. The port will also contain a small fishing harbour and possibly a marina for pleasure craft.

Significant details: The Declaration of Principles (DOP), the agreement between Israel and the PA signed on 13 September 1994, provides for the establishment of a Gaza Port Authority (Article VII DOP). A decision had been taken on the site of the port before the EIA procedure was set in motion. The EIS will provide information about the environmental impacts associated with the choice of the exact location, the port's capacity and design, and the impacts of construction, maintenance, and activities generated by the port.

The Commission's advice for Terms of Reference included recommending that the design of the port and the EIS be drawn up in tandem, with adequate communication between the two. The Netherlands Minister for Development Cooperation gave the green light for drawing up the design in June 1995. During the review it became clear that the fishing harbour and marina were no longer part of the proposal. The Commission also discovered that delays in the research and design process meant that essential information on the risk of salt intrusion caused by boring through impermeable sedimentary layers was not available in the EIS. Essential information on sites for the extraction of building materials was also lacking. The Commission advised that a supplement to the EIS be prepared containing this information to enable decisions to be made about the design of the port and the extraction of building materials. In his request to advice on review of the supplements the minister asked the Commission to review additional information on environmental impacts on a step by step basis, that is in a process of planning through incremental environmental evaluation. In its second advice on review of environmental information the Commission remarks that the information contained in the EIS and its supplements is sufficient for decision-making. The Commission formulates recommendations on registration of ship waste, on sand bypassing, on transport of building materials, on chemical analysis of dredged material, on resettlement and on monitoring and evaluation
